Bulb Garden Care

Bulb plants will flower normally under a wide range of light conditions.
 Bright light will help the stems and leaves to stay sturdy and not "flop".

2. Moderately moist soil is preferred. Allow the soil to dry slightly be-

tween watering. Water thoroughly, then drain the excess water from the saucer or decorative pot cover.

- 3. Cool temperatures are preferred. Bulb plants and gardens should last about 2-weeks under normal home temperatures. To extend the life of you bulb garden, 60 to 65 degrees is the ideal daytime temperature. A cool night temperature of around 50 degrees will also extend flowering.
- 4. After flowering your bulb garden can be discarded.

If you wish to continue growing the bulb garden, keep it watered and in bright light with cool temperatures until the foliage withers. Plant the bulbs outside 6 to 8 inches deep with some Bone Meal or Bulb Food. The number of years to re-flower will depend on the conditions and the size of the bulbs.
